Introduction

The Glasgow Violence Against Women Partnership defines violence against women, children and young people as a function of inequality and an abuse of male power and privilege.

GVAWP recognises the different forms of male violence that women, children and young people may be subject to; domestic abuse, rape and all other forms of sexual violence and abuse, child sexual abuse, stalking and harassment, harmful cultural practices including female genital mutilation, forced and child marriage and so called 'honour crimes'; prostitution; trafficking and other forms of commercial sexual exploitation. GVAWP acknowledges the links between these different forms of violence as well as the importance of understanding links between male violence and child protection.

How to use this booklet

This booklet has been designed to be used by both women looking for services and by workers who are looking to access services for women, children and young people they support.

Part One

Part Two

This section gives detailed information about all the organisations in Glasgow who provide direct services for women, children and young people who have experienced any form of gender based abuse, whether it is happening now or it has happened in the past.

Aims:

To provide an integrated service supportive and responsive to the needs of survivors of rape and sexual assault in the immediate aftermath.

Provision of forensic, health and support services within one central location.

Services:

Single location where anyone over the age of 13 who have experienced rape and serious sexual assault within the last 7 days can attend and:

- Consider options available to them
- Have a forensic medical carried out as sympathetically as possible in private,

this can be done whether the police are involved or not

- Receive emergency contraception and pregnancy testing

- Support if you choose to give a full statement to the police

Aims:

ASSIST is a Specialist Independent Domestic Abuse Advocacy and Support Service focussed on reducing the risk to and improving the safety of victims of domestic abuse, and has Leading Lights Accreditation from CAADA.

ASSIST's aims are to ensure that all victims of domestic abuse, women, children and men, are safe, informed and supported throughout their involvement with the criminal justice system. ASSIST provides both an individual and institutional advocacy service, thereby ensuring that all victims of domestic abuse benefit from the service. Partnership working is at the heart of the ethos of ASSIST.

Services:

ASSIST receives referrals from Police Scotland following a call out in relation to an incident between partners or ex-partners.

ASSIST supports both female and male victims of domestic abuse, offers access to a Risk Assessment and Safety Planning process and provides an opportunity to relay the victim's views into court.

ASSIST's Children's and Young People's Service prioritises high-risk situations including where a child is a cited witness or has witnessed an incident.

Where someone is considered to be at high risk of further harm, ASSIST coordinates MARACs (Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conferences) as a risk management process in Glasgow, Inverclyde, South Lanarkshire and North Lanarkshire with others in development. ASSIST works in partnership with SW Services to provide a partner support service where the perpetrator is participating in a groupwork process.

Glasgow's CEDAR project (Children Experiencing Domestic Abuse Recovery) is hosted at ASSIST in partnership with Glasgow WA. CEDAR provides a therapeutic 12 week groupwork programme for children and young people in recovery from domestic abuse that runs alongside a concurrent groupwork programme for their mothers.

Access:

Most support is offered via telephone with face to face support offered where required. Building is accessible to wheelchairs including lifts and toilets. Interpreters used when needed.

ASSIST operates across the old Strathclyde Police Force area and for male victims only, the area covered by Edinburgh's Domestic Abuse Court.

Aims:

The RESPONSE service can provide a flexible daytime and out of hours service to women, with or without children, fleeing domestic abuse or any other form of gender based violence and who are at risk of homelessness. RESPONSE is not a women only service but is open to anyone who may be deemed vulnerable and who needs emergency accommodation.

Weekday Response:

There are 3 Community Casework Teams (CCTs) in Glasgow that can help women plan to leave a domestic abuse situation by applying for alternative housing. CCTs can also assist women to access temporary flats or Women's Aid refuges if they have to leave immediately.

Weekend/Out of Hours Response:

If a woman wants to leave when CCT offices are closed, she can contact RESPONSE on the free phone number above. Link workers are a mixed female and male team and they work through the night, at weekends and on public holidays. They can arrange transport to get women to temporary accommodation or a safe waiting place if she has to get out of the house urgently. They can also provide some basic essentials such as food and nappies if necessary.
